Code of Student Conduct for Digital Learning

Hello Martin County families. As we move forward in our digital learning adventure, expectations for students may look differently than in traditional settings. Please review these norms and expectations with your child, and contact us if you have questions. Parents, we appreciate your support as you monitor your student's digital activity and learning.

Norms for Online Learning:

- When students are in front of the camera on their device, they must be in appropriate dress, as outlined in School Board policy 5511 Dress Code and School Board policy 5500 Code of Student Conduct.
- 2. Respect each student's right to learn
- 3. Demonstrate respect toward faculty
- 4. When students are attending a live session, they must mute their microphone so no one student's background noise interferes with instruction (remember there are going to be MANY students in each class online at the same time).
- 5. Written or verbal dialogue within the classroom will be appropriate grade level language; "text language" is unacceptable. Any form of profanity/vulgarity is prohibited.
- 6. Inappropriate behavior will result in the student being muted, parent contact and may result in immediate removal up to and including alternative placement, expulsion and/or referred to law enforcement.

Instructional Expectations:

- 1. Teachers will post instructional materials for students to view and learn in Google Classroom.
- 2. Students will have an unique access code for each class on their schedule. Students should access only classes to which they are assigned. Entry into unassigned classes can result in disciplinary consequences.
- 3. Students should contact their teachers through the Google Classroom for assistance or with questions about instruction.
- 4. Students will submit assignments for grades. Grades will be posted in Focus.
- If parents have questions about their student's success in classes, they will need to communicate with the teacher directly. Teachers are using Remind, Zoom, and email to communicate.
