What Accountants and Auditors Do

Accountants and auditors prepare and examine financial records. They ensure that financial records are accurate and that taxes are paid properly and on time. Accountants and auditors assess financial records efficiently.

Work Environment

Most accountants and auditors work full time. In 2016, about 1 in 5 worked more than 40 hours a week, such as at the end of the budget year or during tax season.
