Bullying means systematically and chronically inflicting severe physical hurt or psychological distress on one or more students or staff. It is further defined as unwanted and repeated written, verbal or physical behavior, including any threatening, insulting or dehumanizing gesture by a person that is severe or pervasive enough to create an intimidating, hostile or offensive educational environment; cause severe discomfort or humiliation; or unreasonably interfere with the individual's school or work performance or participation and may involve but is not limited to: teasing, social exclusion, threat, intimidation, stalking, cyber stalking, physical violence, theft, sexual, religious, or racial harassment, public humiliation and destruction of property.
