

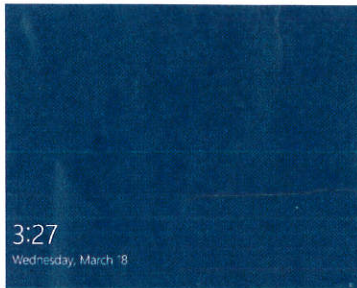
Step 1: Powering on

To power on your laptop press the power button in the top left hand corner above the "esc" key. Some of our laptops have a power button located on the left side of the device(See images Below) .The button will light up and the screen should turn on.

If the laptop doesn't power on, plug the power cord in, wait 10 seconds, and try again. In some cases you may need to leave your laptop plugged in during use.

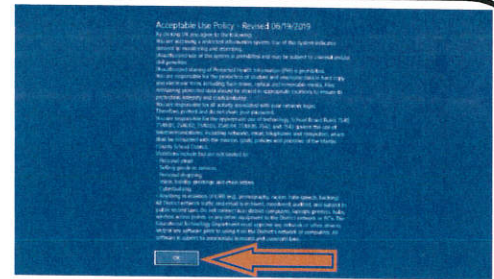


Once the laptop has booted up you will see a blue screen like the one below.



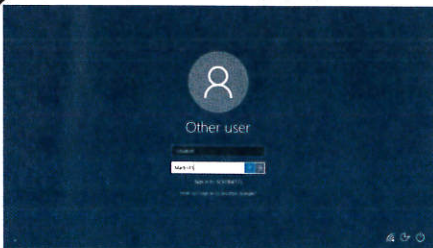
Step 2

Press the spacebar (largest button on the keyboard located bottom center directly above the touchpad)



This will bring up the Acceptable Use Policy (Screenshot Above) Read this and click OK to agree to our Acceptable Use Policy.

Step 3: Logging in



On the next screen, type **.\Student** as your username. Remember to use the **.** or it will not work. Type **Martin11** for your password.

Hit the enter key or click the arrow next to the password field to log in. If this does not work or you get an error, try retyping the username and password. The password is case sensitive, so the M must be capitalized.

Once you are logged in you should see a screen similar to the image on the right. Do not worry if the background is black or the icons are different.



Step 4: Connecting to Wi-Fi

Verify that your Wi-Fi is turned on by looking at the taskbar in the bottom right hand side of the screen. If you see an airplane or a red X over the Wi-Fi emblem, your Wi-Fi may be turned off. If there is an orange light on the F12 key, press and hold the Fn key down on the keyboard and press the F12 key to turn Wi-Fi back on. On one model of laptop there is a dedicated Wi-Fi button that can be pressed at the top right side of the keyboard to toggle Wi-Fi on and off. This should change the look of the network icon.



The icon that appears depends on your current connection state. If you don't see one of the network icons (or a similar one) shown on the left, click the Up arrow(^) to see if it appears there. If the icon does not show up, reboot your device and try again.
