

Martin County School District 2020-2021 HEALTH FORM Requirements - Grades K through 12

PHYSICAL EXAM and current IMMUNIZATION Form #680 is required for both in-school and remote learning

- Students transferring from a **FLORIDA PUBLIC** school have up to **31 days** to provide the completed exam form. **CODE W** If the school does not send a copy the parent must provide one **within 31 days**. The physical from the previous **FL** school is acceptable (even if > 1 year old).
- **Florida PRIVATE** school students **must** present a PE and current Immunization record (Form 680) upon enrollment. The PE may be > 1 year that was used for initial enrollment into the private school. Students transferring from Florida Private School to a Martin County Public school **do not** have a 31 day exemption for the health record enrollment requirements.
- **FIT** students may have **up to 31 days**. **CODE Y** School Health staff will assist those students to obtain the required physical exam for school entry by providing a voucher to a walk-in clinic. Exams **MAY** be on the 3040 FL School Entry Form, but **not required**. They **cannot** be transcribed to the 3040 FL form.
- Religious exempt for vaccines **does not** exempt the student from the Physical Exam Requirement.
- **Out of state or country** students **MUST present a physical examination & Form #680 BEFORE starting school**. The physical must have been completed **within one year** of the school entry date and signed by a licensed provider.
- **Sport Physicals are NOT acceptable for school entry.**
- **HOME SCHOOLED** students on campus for **any reason** (OT, PT, Band, Sports etc.) must have the PE and current Form #680 on file.
- **Religious Exemption from Immunization (DH 681 Form) – Must have original on file in CUM DOE-Code 4**

****Contact School Health staff for every permanent medical exemption CODE 3 FORM #680 to review before student enrolls.**

IMMUNIZATIONS: DOE requires documentation for required immunizations for all students entering, attending, or transferring into a Florida Public school. **CODE 0**=Student **never** steps foot on any campus for **any** reason. **Code W**= **IN-STATE public school** transfers up to **31 days**. **Code X**=Juvenile Justice up to **31days**. **Code Y**=**FIT up to 31 days**.

OUT OF STATE & COUNTRY are required to have up to date immunizations and physical exam within one year before enrolling.

Parents can have the immunization records transcribed to a Form 680 at the Florida Department of Health at no charge.

(A) Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (DTP/DTaP/DT/):

- The fifth dose of diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis vaccine (DTP or DTaP), should be given on or after the child's fourth birthday and prior to entry into kindergarten.
- If the fifth dose of DTP/DTaP vaccine was administered prior to the fourth birthday, the student's immunization record will need to be evaluated by their physician/healthcare provider.
- If the fourth DTP/DTaP dose is administered on or after the fourth birthday, the fifth DTP/DTaP is NOT required.

(P) Tdap (tetanus/diphtheria/pertussis) vaccine **is required for grades 7 - 12 & may be given after the age of 7**. ****Change to code 8 if all other immunizations are complete. (Dtap) entered on Tdap line from FLshots must be entered as a Dtap and counts as the Tdap requirement.**

(D) Polio vaccine: 3, 4, or 5 doses required If four or more doses are administered before age 4 years, an additional dose should be administered at age 4 through 6 years and at least six months after the previous dose. A fourth dose is not necessary if the third dose was administered at age 4 years or older and at least six months after the previous dose.

(F) Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR): 2 doses required 1st dose must be given on or after first birthday to be valid.

(J) Hepatitis B: 3 doses required Children who have no documentation of the hepatitis B vaccine series should be admitted **after** the first dose, issued a temporary medical exemption, and scheduled for the next appropriate dose.

Varicella (Chickenpox):

(K) Varicella vaccine TWO doses are required for grades K through 12 the date of 1st dose given must be on or after 1st birthday)

OR

(L) YEAR of Varicella disease documented by healthcare provider on 680 is entered (vaccine is not required if they had the disease)

(V) Meningitis/Menactra vaccine is not required for school entry-enter in FOCUS under Meningitis Immunization (for college transcripts as well as Epidemiology reports).

- **Providers** should select Part A, Code 1, for children who have completed the requirements for K to 6th grade.
- **Providers** should select Part A, Code 1 and/or Code 8 (all vaccines complete including Tdap) for children who have completed the requirements for K to 6th grade and the Tdap for 7th grade entry. ****Enter DOE CODE 8.**
- **TMEs (temporary medical exemptions-DOE Code 2) must not be issued for children complete for Kindergarten-6th grade.**

Students who started their immunizations after seven years of age:

- Should receive 2 doses of **(Q) Td** vaccine and one **(P) Tdap**.
- Should receive a total of 3 doses of polio vaccine and same requirements for Hepatitis B, MMR and Varicella above.
- **If entering TME DOE Code 2 the expiration date MUST be entered in FOCUS. You will receive a reminder alert in the FOCUS portal 2 weeks before the expiration date for you to call parent to bring in an updated Form #680.**
Code 2's are typically seen for Pre-K until immunizations are complete for K or for students entering from another country.
